Instructions to authors

Kinds of contributions:

The journal *Psychology of Everyday Activity* publishes the following formats:

Original contributions

Original contributions contain results of empirical research, method developments, or theoretical reflections (max. 40,000 characters).

Research reviews

Research reviews encompass the current state of research considering a specific subject (max. 50,000 characters).

Research notes

Research notes represent pilot studies or replications, or inform about new research projects or research programs and their first results (max. 20,000 characters).

Discussion

Discussion contributions take argumentatively position on a discussion-worthy topic with reference to psychological research or practice (max. 20,000 characters).

Book reviews

Reviews refer to a new published work from the psychological research or practice (max. 8,000 characters).

Submission of manuscripts:

Manuscripts should consider the usual guidelines of manuscript design of the German Society of Psychology (DGPs) or the American Psychological Association (APA). However, in contrast to the guidelines of DGPs or APA we ask the authors to set those passages which should appear in *italics* in the printing version *already* in the manuscript version in italics. The abstract should not exceed 1,000 characters. Contributions can be written in German or English language. If a manuscript is written in German language, both a German *and* an English abstract should be submitted. Following the abstract, up to six Keywords should be listed. In German contributions the keywords should indicated both in German and in English.

In order to ensure an anonymous review, the names of the authors should appear only on the title page.

Tables and figures should be numbered and attached separately at the end of the manuscript. The place in which the respective table or figure shall be inserted should be marked in the manuscript text.
